SUMMARY OF ASSESSMENT

The company may undertake further assessments where unwell individuals have slept such as a hotel room or boarding school dormitory) or there is visible contamination with body fluids. In these cases, then the need for additional PPE might be necessary. The local Public Health England (PHE) Health Protection Team (HPT) can advise on this.

The organisation may need to undertake further assessments where environmental conditions / individual capacity identifies a need.

METHODS

All cleaning staff

- Avoid public transport to travel to work where possible wear face covering if not possible
- Wash hands or use sanitiser on arrival at work
- Avoid using Lifts where not possible restrict to one person only travelling in the lift at one time
- Stagger cleaning staff visits to stores/cleaning cupboards etc to avoid groups of staff in one area
- Staff not to congregate in one area to wait for shift start
- Wash hands regularly throughout the day
- Sanitise hands after using shared equipment (buffing machine)
- Adhere to workplace rules and control measures
- Observe social distancing and allow other business users to pass or finish activities before entering a confined area, using equipment or washing facility

Mobile staff

- 2 metre social distancing is to be adhered to where possible :
 - \circ $\;$ Where not possible staff site side by side and ventilate vehicle, Face Mask to be worn
 - \circ $\,$ Vans are to be used by only one or two employees where practical
- Vehicles interiors are to be sanitised daily after use
- Sites to be managed remotely where possible, through phone calls and emails.
- Only one employee at a time to go to the van to unload work equipment, obtain water and cleaning materials etc Where unavoidable, ie to move heavy items needing 2 people, wear face masks
- Vehicles and Cleaning equipment:
 - Vehicle interior to be sanitised daily
 - \circ $\;$ Interior contact points to be sanitized when re-entering the vehicle at the end of a visit.
- Personal hygiene:
 - Catch coughs and sneezes in a tissue and dispose of straight away and wash/sanitise your hands or cough and sneeze into your arm/sleeve

- Wash hands or use hand sanitizer regularly and after touching item commonly touched by others
- o Wear freshly washed clothes daily, do not reuse potentially contaminated clothing
- Equipment:
 - Cleaning equipment should be cleaned in disinfectant / viricidal solution to remove contamination as appropriate
 - Mopheads, cloths should be allowed to soak in disinfectant / viricidal solution to remove contamination or disposed of in a controlled waste stream
 - Cleaning staff should wear gloves at all times whilst at work. For prolonged use employees should wash with soap and water or sanitise their gloves whilst still being worn on the completion of a job.
 - Safety Glasses are to be worn if the potential for splashing exists
